Issues in the Philosophy of Mind and Action

Philosophy of mind and action are engaged with empirical research more than most areas of philosophy, and therefore debates evolve as empirical findings develop. This workshop brings together four different talks which focus on various issues in the philosophy of mind and action, such as the nature of perceptual experience in the light of recent findings in psychophysics; the nature of conscious phenomenology, and whether there is phenomenology at all; the nature of risk, and in particular the nature of decision making under epistemic self-doubt; and continuity in evaluative outlook.
